

Respected sir the following is suggested to prevent the resurgence of the Covid19 after lockdown is over:-

1. Since very little is known about this virus. Therefore, in order to prevent the mass infection in children and youth, all the academic institutions must remain closed till the country is declared free from this virus. Because any spread of this infection in the younger generation will be devastating for the country.

2. All the industrial units, Govt. offices and private establishments may become functional after declared lockdown period is over. However, the units must work with minimum staff which may be increased gradually over the weeks depending upon the improvement in the situation.

3. The Govt. must notify a minimum of three slots for the office timing ( both for Govt. and private offices) to avoid peak hour rush in public transport till the situation is contained properly.

4. The inter- city and inter-district movement of the people must not be allowed( except in the emergency) at least for a period of 14-28 days from the end of lockdown to rule out any possibility of the transmission of disease by any asymptomatic carrier across the cities/ district. In case any person moves across the city or district under emergency he must be monitored invariably by the state authorities at least for a period of 14 to 20 days.

5. Inter- State movements of the people must not be allowed except in case of the emergency till the states have been declared free from the virus. By doing so the Govt. will be in position to utilise resources in much focused , localised and efficient way.

6. All the homeless persons and migrant labourers must be enrolled and taken care off by the respective village/ city/ district authorities during lockdown. They may be given employment after lockdown is over as is where basis.

7. Till the country is declared free from the virus the tourism of all kind must be kept suspended. As most of the tourist spots especially the hill stations are devoid of facilities and have very tough terrain. therefore, if under any circumstances the infection is introduced to the remote and interiors of hill stations by means of tourism it will be very difficult to treat and contain the infection.

8. Masks and gloves should be made readily available even in far flung village areas, where distribution of these items to the general public may be done by law enforcing agencies which are often patrolling the areas to maintain lockdown.

9. 9. Social distancing must be made mandatory in public area.

10. 10. People should be advised to maintain good basic hygiene especially in slums and remote areas with population having low literacy rates.

11. 11. Routine sanitisation of shops, office buildings, and facilities used to lodge the migrant worker and homeless for their safety and health.
